Lenexa's Spinach Heritage:

(Taken from the Kansas City Star/Times, May 17, 1939)

"The shipping season is getting under way for the truck gardeners of this section, and



farmers are busy with the spinach harvest. Mary Louise Verstraete, 16-year-old daughter of

Mr. and Mrs. Julius Verstraete, is busily engaged in cutting the plant on her parents' farm, a mile northeast of Lenexa, Kas. Five

freight cars full and three truck loads were shipped yesterday at a loading dock near by." *(This site is today the corner of 87th Street Parkway and Quivira Road.)*

During the 1930's, truck farms, operated by Belgian immigrants, surrounded Lenexa. Areas that now encompass the city of Lenexa, and many of the surrounding subdivisions, once raised spinach along with other vegetables. The Spinach Festival commemorates this heritage. The day of fun includes games, entertainment, antiques, arts and craft sales, contests, raffles, and history lessons in Sar-Ko-Par Trails Park.



Each September the Lenexa Historical Society, with the City of Lenexa and others, sponsor the Lenexa Spinach Festival, and this year the Spinach Festival will be held on the first Saturday after Labor Day, September 12, 2009 to continue the celebration of Lenexa's claim as Spinach Capital of the World.

The new exhibit, set to open October 22, 2009 and run through April 17, 2010, will tell a story about the very beginning of Lenexa (info on James Butler Hickok, Shawnee Indians, Na-Nex-Se, Chief Blackhoof, Santa Fe Trail, C.A. Bradshaw, Octave Chanute) and of course, The Railroad. Visitors will see how these things worked together and changed the life in this area dramatically, along with the growth of Lenexa and how we maintain Old Town Lenexa's image because that is where it all began – Keeping history alive for future generations in Lenexa.

has spent his career in the railroad industry, was able to provide us with interesting facts on the industry as it developed across the U.S.

Legler Barn Herb Garden Eagle Scout Leadership Project

Dylan Crow, a Life Scout from Troop 186 (Lenexa United Methodist Church in Lenexa, KS) will be performing some renovation work to the Legler Barn Herb Garden as part of his Eagle Scout Leadership Service Project.

In his project write-up (presented and approved by the LHS Board of Directors, LHS President, Dylan's Troop, and the Boy Scouts of America, Trails West District Eagle Committee) Dylan outlines several goals of the project:

Item 1—Existing Benches: There are currently two concrete benches that have sunk into the ground and are in need of repair. Dylan's goal is to place a slab under the benches to stabilize them and replace them if they are found to be damaged.



Item 2—Trellis/Pergola: The existing trellis is missing some parts and the wood is splintering and not pleasant to sit on, nor is the structure stable. Dylan's goal is to

build a new pergola and



replace the wooden benches with concrete benches, thus improving the structure, its usability, and the overall appearance.

Item 3—Garden Appearance: The final item within Dylan's project involves working with the current volunteers who maintain the garden to acceptably remove the weeds around the brick pathways within the garden.



The trellis and possibly the benches in Herb Garden were constructed in 1994

and through Dylan's Eagle Scout Leadership Service Project, he hopes to restore these items to their original glory and usefulness.

Dylan hopes to carry out his project over the next several months and into the spring, hopefully completing the work in time for next year's BBQ and Spinach Festivals. Also, as part of Dylan's project, he will be conducting a car wash and collecting donations to cover the costs of the project, expected to run around \$800.

This year the Lenexa Chili Challenge will take place on Friday, October 16th and Saturday, October 17th, and as usual, to be held in Old Town Lenexa (the corner of Santa Fe Trail Drive and Pflumm Road), where over 100 teams compete in two divisions: Competition (C.A.S.I.) Chili and Home Style Chili. In 1999 a Salsa Division was added that has been very popular along with a hot wing contest .

Chili contestants generally show up Friday afternoon and begin setting up their booth space with the festivities beginning at 5:00 pm Friday night with live music and activities for all. The official contest begins Saturday at 9 a.m. and concludes at 4 p.m. with the announcement of the winners.

Admission charge of \$1 per adult. Children under 12 free. There will be chili to sample (on Saturday), games, music, and live entertainment.
